

SON SUCCEEDS HIS FATHER AS FIRM HEAD

J. C. Mahannah has been elected to succeed his father, A. E. Mahannah, as head of the Memphis branch of the Kelsey Wheel Co., it was announced at the annual meeting of the directors at Detroit.

Mahannah's father died Oct. 12. Mahannah has been with the Kelsey Wheel Co. for 10 years, and for the past four years has been secretary-treasurer.

MAHANNAH ELECTED HEAD KELSEY WHEEL

Succeeds to Position Formerly Held by Father.

J. C. Mahannah, for more than ten years connected with the Kelsey Wheel Company in different capacities, has been elected head of the Memphis branch of the firm by the board of directors in annual session at Detroit, according to advices received in Memphis. R. E. Stritch, who has been connected with the company for about four years, in charge of the accounting department, has been named secretary.

Mr. Mahannah was elected to succeed his father, the late A. E. Mahannah, who died last October 12. Mr. Mahannah has served as secretary and treasurer of the company for the last four years, and will now act as president, treasurer and general manager.

Memphis is one of five units maintained by the Kelsey Wheel, making approximately one-fourth of the output of the company at large. Detroit has three units, and Windsor, Ont., one. Memphis is engaged in the manufacture of wheels exclusively at present. A new body plant was built a few years ago, but was recently sold to the Fisher-St. Louis Body Corporation. The Memphis branch has a payroll of about 500 employees.
