

APPEALS TO MAYOR BOURNE

BEATRICE, Neb., Aug. 8.—(Special.)—A. M. Weinberger, through his attorney, L. W. Conby, recently addressed the following somewhat remarkable communication to Mayor Bourne. The officers deny emphatically that they used any abusive language towards him and Messrs. Cummings and Otto are extremely indignant over Weinberger's attempt to connect them with the matter. As to his statement about the Journal correspondent's visit at the jail, it is correct except as to his being without a hat. He had gone there with the telegraph office in company with the correspondent of the World-Herald, but not without a hat. It is true, also, that Chief Herman was not there until some time after the gathering and nearly all the tar had been removed from Weinberger's body, both correspondents being there at the time. It will be remembered that Weinberger was arrested on the written request of his wife, who afterwards refused to prosecute him, for which reason the case was dismissed.
