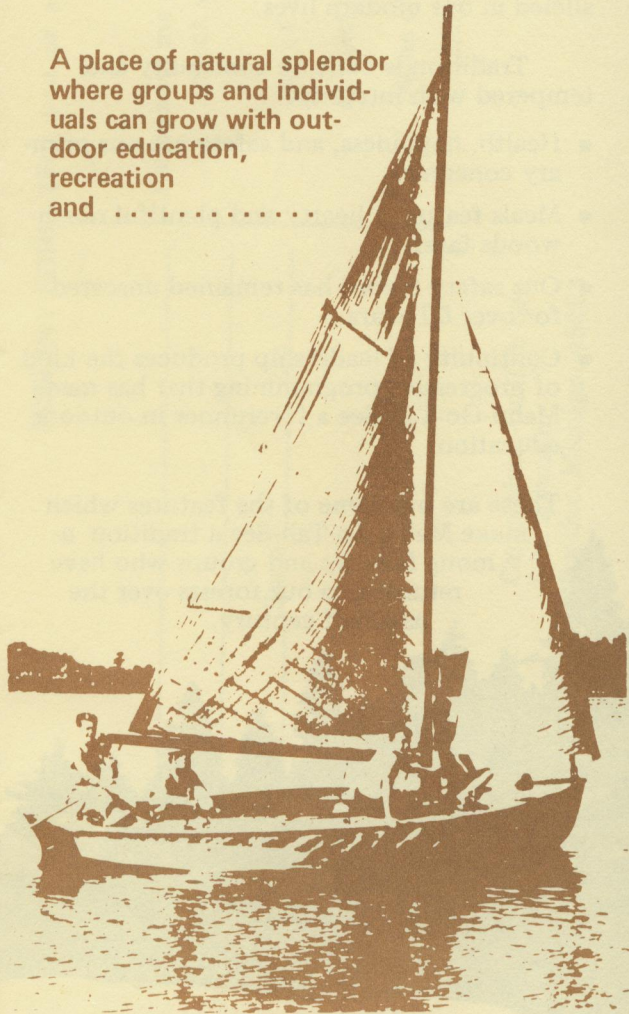


Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See

Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See is a multi-use camping and conference center which annually hosts boys' camping, coed camping, band camps, conservation and ecology groups, and many other interest groups.

Located just north of Hale, Michigan, Mahn-Go-Tah-See is a sanctioned Wildlife Preserve with over 250 acres of wooded hills and meadows, and over 1¼ miles of natural lakeshore on Loon Lake.

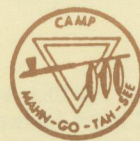
There is a natural sustenance here amidst the splendor of our ancient forests which creates an atmosphere of learning and fun unparalleled in our modern lives.

BOYS CAMP



Since its conception, Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See has functioned primarily as a boys camp. Today, although we have become more diversified, our prime interest is still that of boys camping.

For boys ages 7-15, Mahn-Go-Tah-See offers an opportunity to grow and mature in the fresh air of the great north woods. The adventure of living together in a woodland setting, in harmony with the unspoiled forests, is one of the most memorable experiences in a boy's life.

Staff

Our staff of counselors and instructors is comprised of college students and teachers, under the direction of a mature professional administrative staff with many years of camp leadership, who care about giving your son the best possible guidance.

Housing

Boys are divided into three age groups, each with separate living areas. The Chippewa and Huron villages for ages 7-9 and 10-12 are housed in cabin groups. Boys ages 13-15 live in platform tents in the Ottawa village, known as the Outpost, and learn about rustic living, building toward a 4-day canoe trip each session.

Program

Activities are headed by well-qualified instructors who gear your son's experiences to his own level, with progressive challenges and responsibilities. Your son will have the freedom to make daily choices from a challenging yet fun-filled array of program offerings.

PROGRAM OFFERINGS

Sailing Our sailing fleet and instruction has enough variety to satisfy both beginners and seasoned salts.

Riflery Our NRA approved rifle range is closely supervised by mature leadership.

Swimming This is a vital skill for personal safety. Our certified instructors teach Red Cross swimming classes from Beginners through Life Saving.

Crafts The Crafts Center is a relaxing, productive area where the use of natural materials is emphasized.

Canoeing Individual instruction assures safe handling as we explore the waterways in the traditional craft of native Americans.

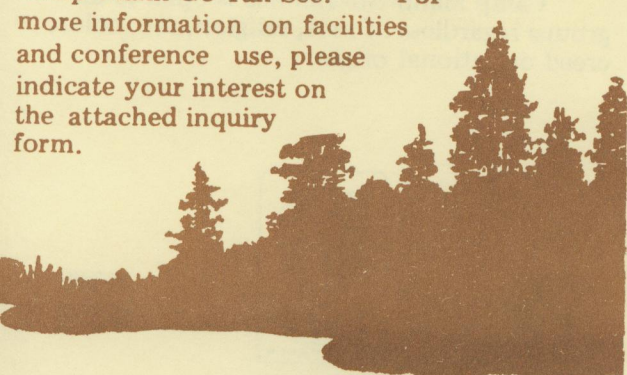
Nature Prominent Michigan naturalist, Homer "Gus" Roberts, unwinds nature's mysteries as our resident naturalist.
