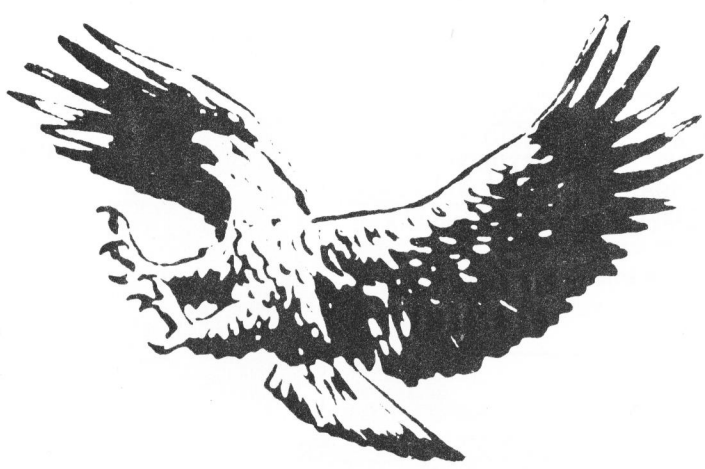

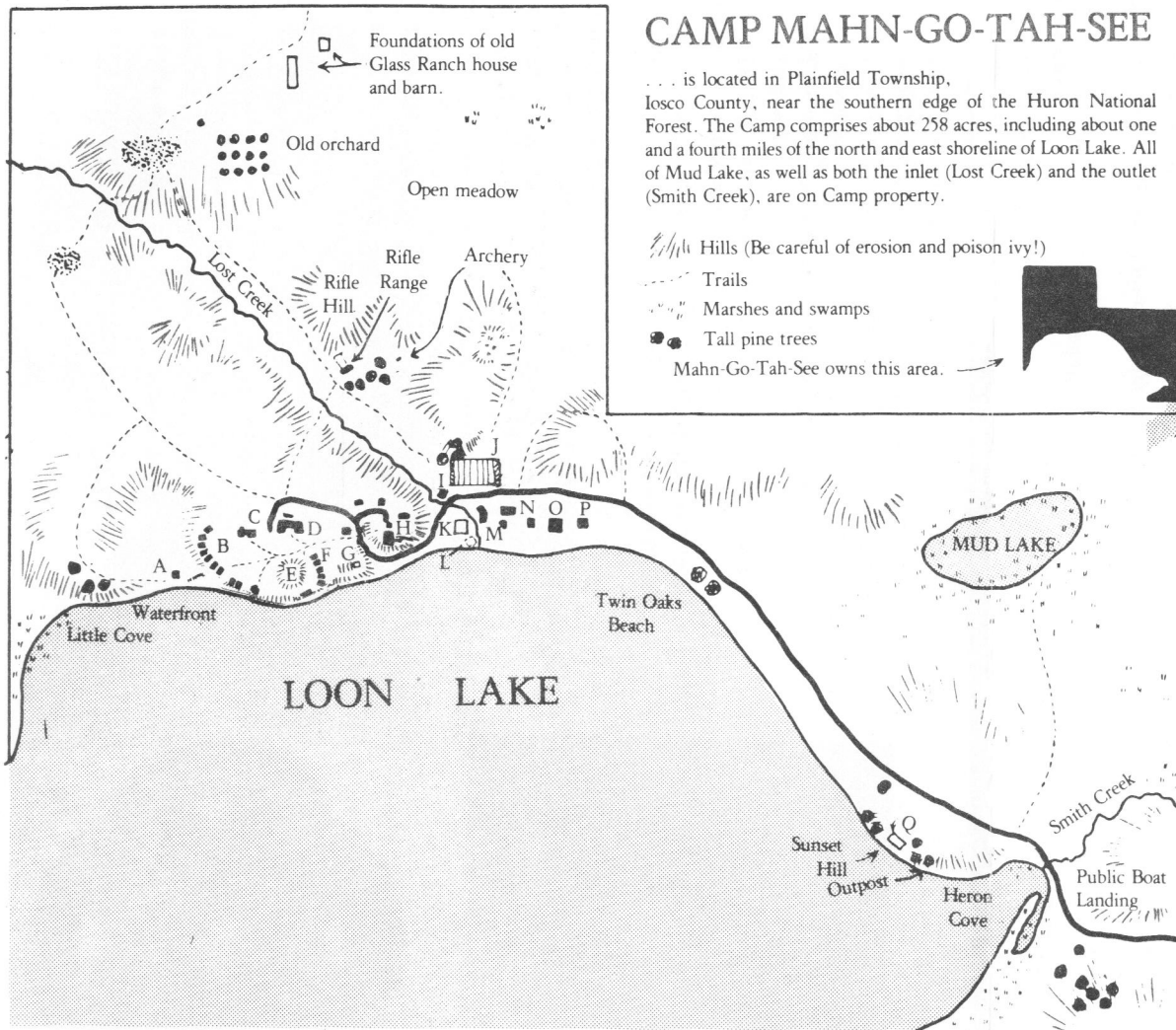

CAMP MAHN-GO-TAH-SEE

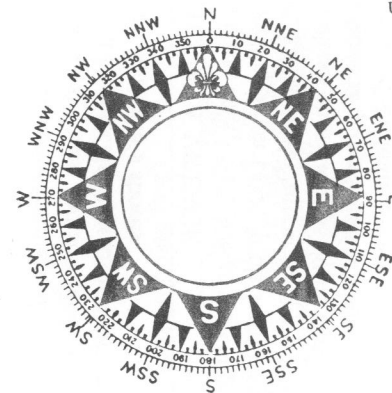
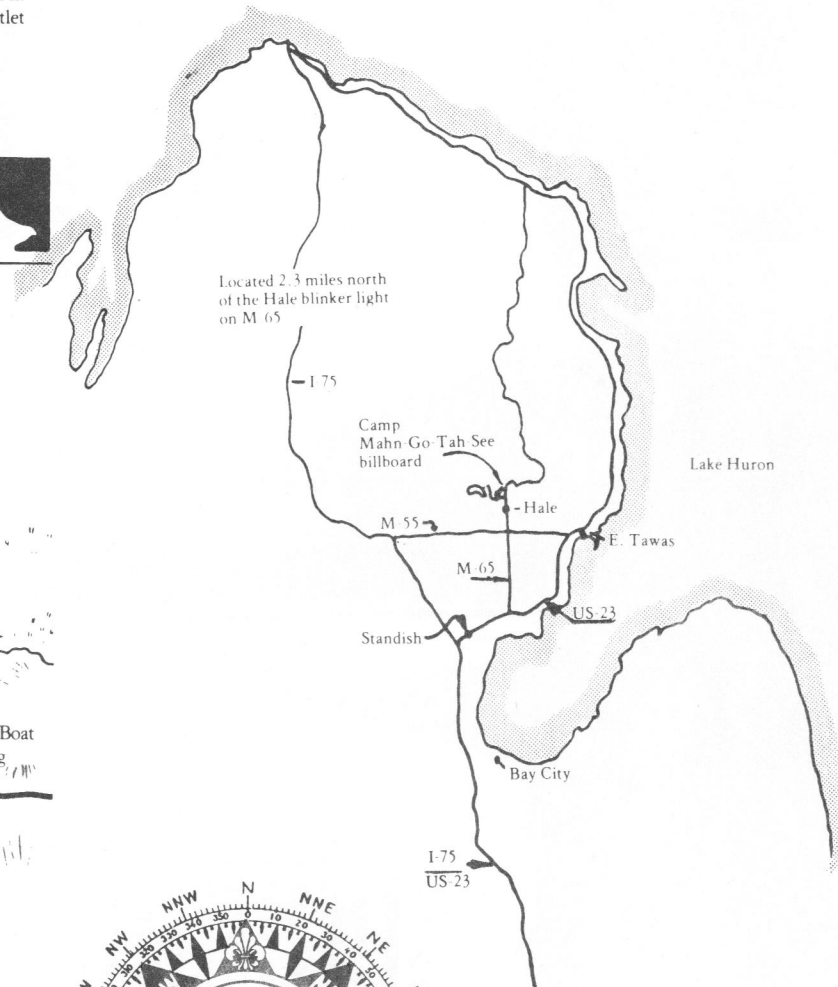
... is located in Plainfield Township, Iosco County, near the southern edge of the Huron National Forest. The Camp comprises about 258 acres, including about one and a fourth miles of the north and east shoreline of Loon Lake. All of Mud Lake, as well as both the inlet (Lost Creek) and the outlet (Smith Creek), are on Camp property.

Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See is located at the edge of the Huron National forest and the AuSable River basin which echoes with rich logging era history. A unique feature is Mahn-Go-Tah-See's status as a State-sanctioned Wildlife Preserve with 258 acres of wooded hills and meadows, and a 1¼ mile lakeshore on beautifully clear Loon Lake. A certain silent magic resides in our ancient forests and creates an atmosphere of learning and fun unparalleled in our modern lives.

Tradition is built on continuity and tempered with integrity. With over 50 years in boys camping, Mahn-Go-Tah-See's program is steeped in tradition.

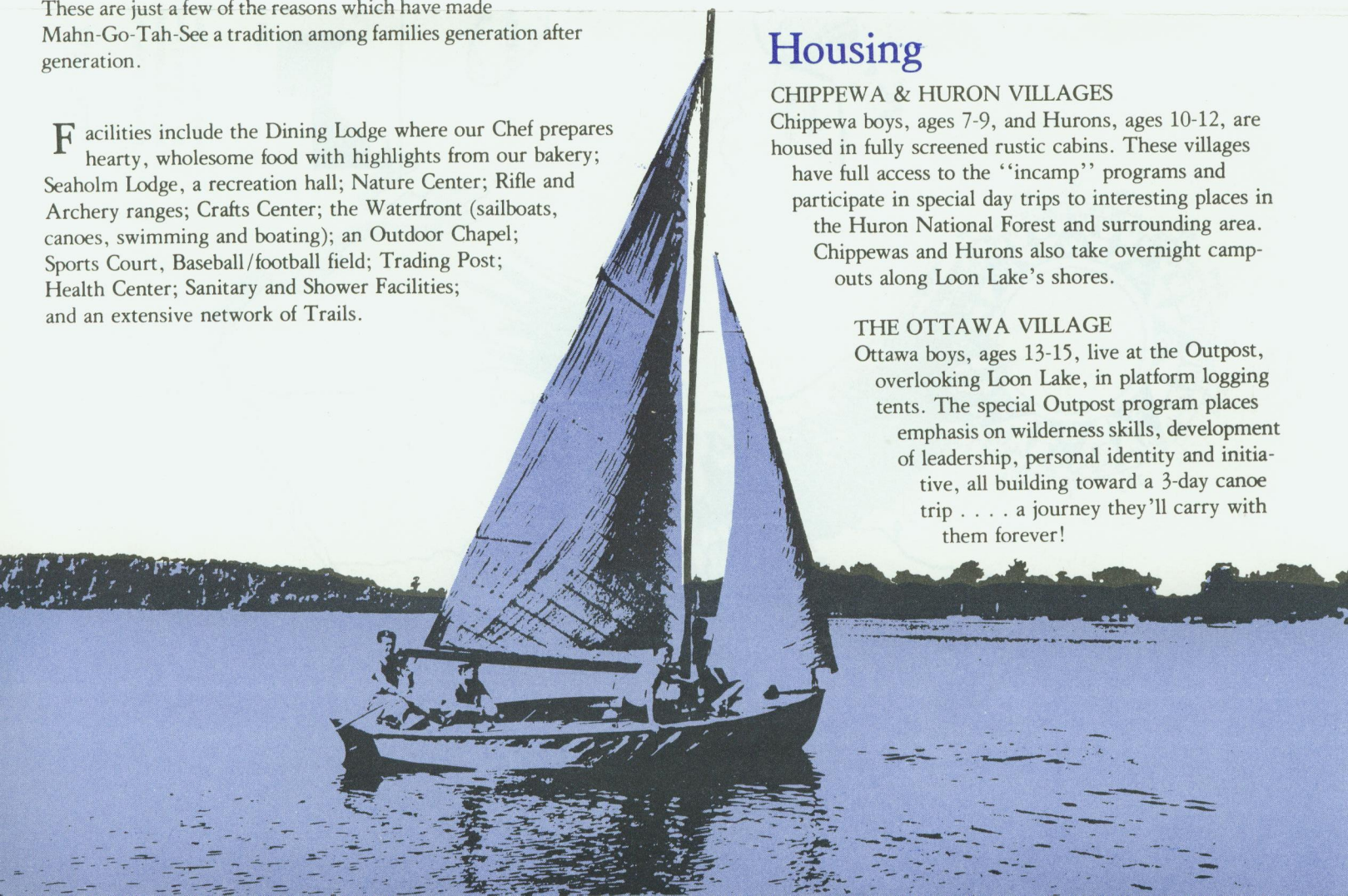
Housing

CHIPPEWA & HURON VILLAGES

Chippewa boys, ages 7-9, and Hurons, ages 10-12, are housed in fully screened rustic cabins. These villages have full access to the "incamp" programs and participate in special day trips to interesting places in the Huron National Forest and surrounding area. Chippewas and Hurons also take overnight camp-outs along Loon Lake's shores.

THE OTTAWA VILLAGE

Ottawa boys, ages 13-15, live at the Outpost, overlooking Loon Lake, in platform logging tents. The special Outpost program places emphasis on wilderness skills, development of leadership, personal identity and initiative, all building toward a 3-day canoe trip ... a journey they'll carry with them forever!



Program

Activities are headed by well qualified instructors who gear the boys' experiences to their own level, with progressive challenges and responsibilities. Boys have the freedom to make daily choices from a challenging yet fun-filled array of program offerings.

SAILING - Our fleet has enough variety to satisfy all levels, with special races each period.

SWIMMING - This is a vital skill for personal safety. Our certified instructors teach Red Cross classes from Beginners to Lifesaving.

RIFLERY & ARCHERY - Our ranges are closely supervised by mature certified leadership who teach a healthy respect for safety.

CRAFTS - The Craft Center is a relaxing, productive area where the use of natural materials is emphasized and personal expression set free.

NATURE - Prominent Michigan naturalist, Homer "Guss" Roberts, unwinds nature's mysteries as our Resident Naturalist utilizing our "hands on" Nature Center and trail network throughout the Wildlife Preserve.

CANOEING - Individual instruction assures safe handling as we explore waterways in the traditional craft of native Americans.

FISHING - Loon Lake provides some of the finest angling in northeast Michigan.

CAMP CRAFT - Outdoor living skills and woodland adventures combined with Indian craft challenge the imagination and ingenuity through innovative experiences.

FOCUS PROGRAM - Our Focus classes offer boys an opportunity to obtain in-depth instruction and advanced concepts in areas such as Nature, Sailing, Camp Craft, and Riflery. Focus classes cut deeper into these areas with more concentrated information, projects and field trips.



Staff

Our staff is comprised of counselors and teachers who are chosen for their enthusiasm, program skills, leadership, personal character and resourcefulness. Direction is provided by a mature professional administrative staff with many years of camp leadership who care about giving boys the best possible guidance. Along with annual pre-camp training and child management seminars, all of our staff is trained and certified in CPR and choke prevention techniques.

Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See is operated by a non-profit corporation with a Board of Directors comprised of 20 highly skilled business and professional men from Michigan who devote endless hours annually to building and maintaining one of the finest camping facilities in Michigan.

Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See is open to all groups regardless of race, religion, sex, color, creed or national origin.

Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See is licensed and approved by the Michigan Department of Social Services.
